

My Final Session With the RRRH Internship

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Over the course of the past semester, our research team has seen many successes. In October alone, (1) I presented our interview findings via a virtual poster presentation at the American Public Health Association Annual Meeting (for which we also won the Public Health Education and Health Promotion Student Award!), (2) we gave our first presentation on all of our cumulative findings to the Reproductive

Rights and Reproductive Health interns meeting, and (3) we had our first manuscript published in the American Journal of Health Promotion!
