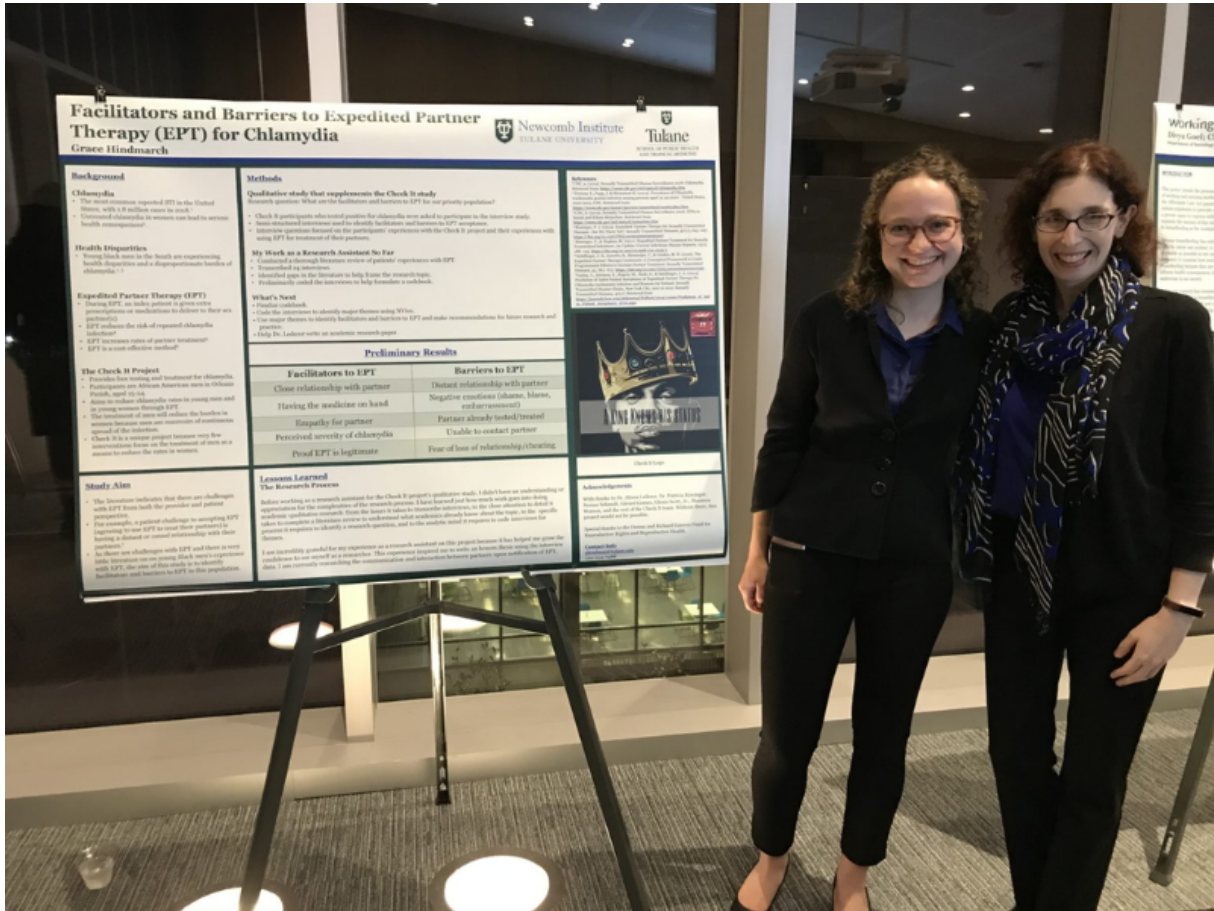


Graduating as a RRRH Intern
