This summer I will be volunteering at the Orleans Public Defenders' as an Intern Investigator. The Orleans Public Defenders Office strives to provide excellent representation for the poor.

It is committed to protecting the rights ensured by the Louisiana and United States Constitutions and maintaining abidance to the rule of law; cultivating a more open, inclusive society by providing indigent populations with access to the protection of the courts; and aiding in the construction and extension of rehabilitation and alternative programs for clients and their families.

It will afford me a unique perspective into the criminal justice system, specifically that of New Orleans, as well as grant me the unparalleled opportunity to impact the lives of others.
