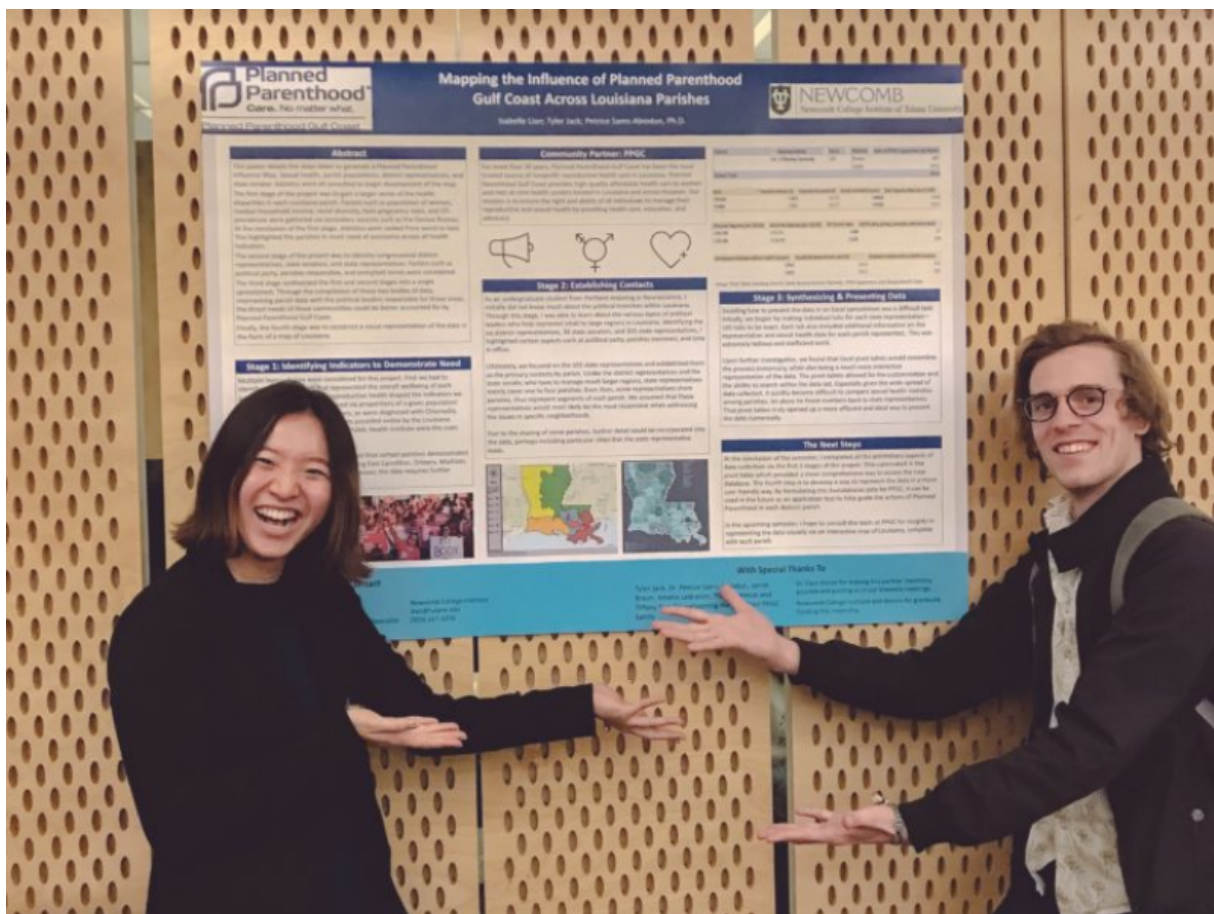


# Continuing my Work with Planned Parenthood Gulf Coast this Spring!
