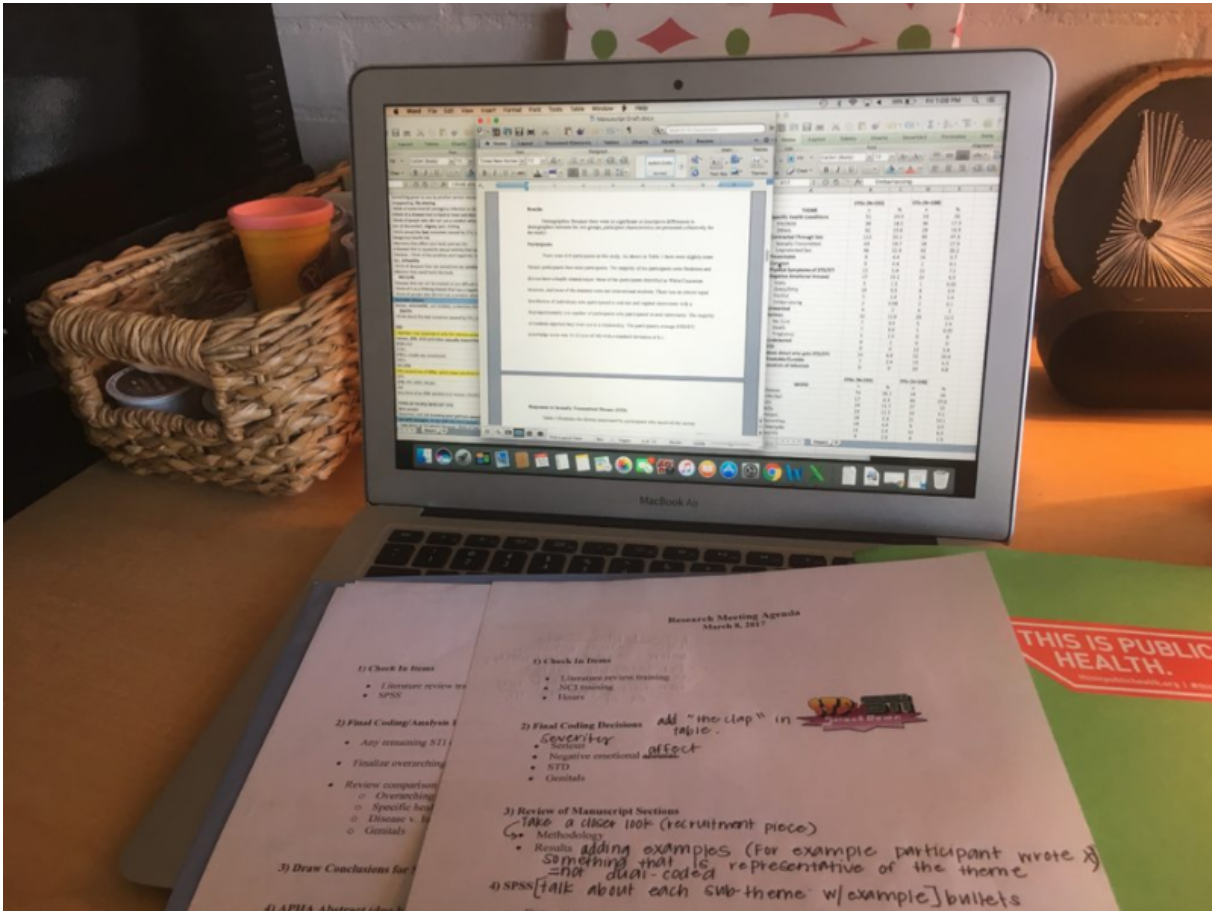


First weeks as a research assistant!

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My time spent working with Dr. Alyssa Lederer has been enriching and encouraging thus far. Our research project involves looking at young people's perceptions of the terms sexually transmitted disease (STD) and sexually transmitted infection (STI). We are working to determine if, and how adolescents differentiate between the two terms. These terms are often used synonymously in health education however there is conjecture in the medical and public health fields that people perceive the two phrases differently. Through my sex education at home in Oregon, and training as a peer health educator and get yourself tested educator I have always used STI. For
