Watching the mother's development over the past few months and finally seeing her have her child was rewarding and taught me the significance of patience in the birthing process.

I also recently wrapped up my intern project here, advertising for our half-priced deals that occurs every third wednesday of the month. My project was to make flyers and signs and hand them out both in Ciudad Vieja and Antigua. We had the highest amount of people we ever had according to my boss. Currently I am on call for the next birth that should take place by next week.
